Orientation/Introduction to 4-H Trail and Packing: Saturday January 7, 2023, Location – Forest Service Supervisors office, 650 Wolf Pack Way, Kalispell

1:00pm to 4:00pm – Refreshments will be served. We will do an intro to packing equipment, goals, student experience. 4-H Horsemanship will be discussed and general 4-H requirements. Horse Etiquette will be discussed. Level 2 and 3 students will share what they learned last year and Level 4 and 5 students will share their packing experiences from the summer of 2021. There will also be a demonstration on packing and horse desensitizing. Weather Permitting All Leaders attending

The Horse Helmet Video will be shown at the end of the introduction for those who need to get this done for 2022. All new 4-H members and those turning 14 will need to view the video and sign off on the proper documents.

Any Level 4 & 5 students with a new horse for 2022 will need to bring them to Clinic III and IV for evaluation. Make sure that you let leaders know what you need to work on.

Loading and Packing "Hands-on" practice stations with "Barrel Horses"

We will have 6 Stations for Hands on Training

- 1. Mantying Knots/Hitches for Packing, making loads
- 2. Panniers Making loads
- 3. Top Pack adding a top pack to your loads & Fitting a Pack Saddle Video's on saddle placement and how to adjust a Pack Saddle
- 4. Highline Putting up Highline, tying quick release knot, tying to post, tree, rail
- 6. Tying on Loads Barrel Horses

4-H packing students will be broken up in to 6 groups and they will have 45 minutes or more at each station.

The last 30 to 45 minutes students will practice putting up a highline and tying quick release knots.

Participants should bring their own riding and pack saddles. If you do not have pack saddles, we will have a few extra for use at the clinic. We will also have a limited amount of stock that the instructors will bring for those who do not have pack stock please let us know if you need pack stock.

Level 1 thru 3 Students

- 1. Riding Horses and Rider will be put through Trail Riding Course; Pack Horses will be led through the same course. Pre-made loads will be available for those who can tie a load on their pack stock.

For those with new riding or packing horses for 2022 you will be evaluated on their ability during this clinic.
